Day 1 Tuesday, June 26, 2018

Departure via scheduled air service to London

Day 2 Wednesday, June 27 London / Stonehenge / Cardiff (D)

Arrive in London

Meet your MCI Tour Manager, who will assist the group to the awaiting motorcoach for transfer to Cardiff. Stop at Stonehenge, located around 30 minutes north of Salisbury on the beautiful Salisbury Plain. It is Europe's most famous prehistoric monument and you can sense the mystery that shrouds the ancient stones that were constructed over 5,000 years ago!

Continue on to Cardiff for late afternoon hotel check-in

Evening dinner and overnight

Cardiff, the capital city of Wales since 1955, is one of Europe's fastest growing cities. It has developed from being a pleasant capital with a fine maritime history into a vibrant state-of-the-art city with an exciting future. It is also an ancient city, and the legacy left by the Romans, Normans, and the Industrial Revolution is clearly visible

Day 3 Thursday, June 28 Cardiff (B,D)

Breakfast at the hotel

Enjoy a morning guided tour of Cardiff Castle, which stands in the very center of the city. The castle contains some of the most important historic interiors in Britain and occupies the site where a Roman fort once stood. Also visit the Museum of Welsh Life at St. Fagan's on the western outskirts of the city. Here, travel back in time and experience how life in Wales would have been at various stages over time. The outdoor museum contains cottages, farmhouses, a chapel, school, Elizabethan mansion, etc.

Day 4 Friday, June 29 Cardiff / Bath / London (B,D)

Breakfast at the hotel

Transfer to Bath. Bath is admired the world over for its architectural beauty. It was originally the Roman town Aque Sulis, established in the first century AD, with a great religious spa at its heart

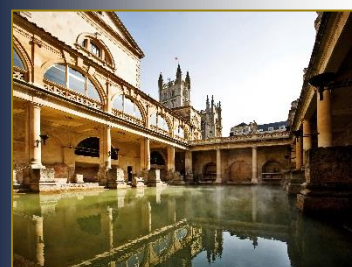
Sing a recital in Bath Abbey

Lunch, on own

Enjoy a visit to the Roman Baths. The pools, pipes and under floor heating are remarkable demonstrations of the ingenuity of Roman engineering. Also visit the neighboring Abbey Church, renowned for the lofty fifteenth-century vault of its choir

Continue to London for dinner and overnight

Established 1,250 years ago, London became an important Roman city. It was resettled by the Saxons in the fifth century, after the end of the Roman occupation. London has been



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scourged by the plague (1665) and was almost entirely destroyed by the Great Fire (1666). World War II's "Blitzkrieg" tore up the city considerably. She stands today as a monument to perseverance, culture, excitement, history, and greatness

Day 5 Saturday, June 30 London (B,D)

Breakfast at the hotel

A guided tour of London includes the residential and shopping districts of Kensington and Knightsbridge. Pass Westminster Abbey, where most English Kings and Queens have been crowned since 1066, and where many are buried. See Whitehall and Trafalgar Square with Nelson's Column, past Big Ben and the Houses of Parliament to Buckingham Palace, where you might see the Changing of the Guard

Day 6 Sunday, July 1 London / Windsor / Cambridge (B,D)

Breakfast at the hotel

Transfer to Cambridge. Stop in Windsor for a tour of Windsor Castle, which was built 900 years ago by William the Conqueror to guard the western approach to London. Today, it is England's largest castle and also the largest inhabited stronghold in the world. Highlights of the visit will be St. George's Chapel and, subject to royal commitments, the State Apartments

Continue to Cambridge

Evening dinner and overnight

Abounding with exquisite architecture, exuding history and tradition and renowned for its quirky rituals, Cambridge is a university town extraordinaire. The tightly packed core of ancient colleges, the picturesque riverside 'Backs' (college gardens) and the leafy green meadows surrounding the city give it a more tranquil appeal than its historic rival Oxford.

Day 7 Monday, July 2 Cambridge (B,L)

Afternoon visit to Wimpole Estate. The Mansion at the heart of the estate is evidence of Elsie Bambridge's success in creating a home. Intimate rooms contrast with beautiful and unexpected Georgian interiors, including Soane's breathtaking Yellow Drawing Room and wonderful plunge bath

Enjoy a tour of Cambridge taking in the River Cam, St. John's college, University of Cambridge, Cambridge American cemetery and memorial. Visit Fitzwilliam Museum



Also Visit King's College and King's College Chapel, which was built between 1446 and 1515. It is particularly famous for its vaulted roof, which weighs an enormous 2,000 tons! In addition, the stalls and screen are very fine. The Choir of King's College Cambridge is famous throughout the world, due to their many recordings and highly televised Christmas service 'Carols from King's'

Attend evensong at Kings College Chapel

Day 9 Wednesday, July 4 Cambridge / Ely (B,D)

Breakfast at the hotel

Enjoy a guided tour of Ely, a small but charming city dominated by monastic buildings, many medieval house and a jaw-dropping cathedral, which has its origins in 672 AD when St. Ethelreda built an Abbey Church. Highly regarded by historians and architects from all over the world for its beauty and size, Ely Cathedral is the only UK building to be listed as one of the "Seven Wonders of the Middle Ages"
